- 0. This Licence ("the Licence") is issued by the Secretary of State on **25 April 2003** and replaces any previous authority granted in respect of the service subject to this Licence.
- 1. This Licence authorises **REVCOM** ("the Licensee") to establish, install and/or use radio transmitting and/or receiving stations and/or radio apparatus as described in the schedule(s) (hereinafter together called "the Radio Equipment") subject to the terms set out below.

Licence Term

2. This Licence shall continue in force until revoked by the Secretary of State or surrendered by the Licensee.

Licence Variation and Revocation

3. The Secretary of State may exercise his power to vary or revoke this Licence by a written notice served on the Licensee or by a general notice applicable to holders of this class of Licence published by public broadcast or in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes.

Changes

- 4. This Licence may not be transferred.
- 5. The Licensee must give prior or immediate notice to the Secretary of State in writing of any change in the details of the name and/or address recorded above.



Fees

- 6. The Licensee shall pay to the Secretary of State the relevant fee as provided in section 2(1) of the Wireless Telegraphy Act 1949 and the Regulations made thereunder:
 - () on or before the date of issue of this Licence; and/or
 - (a) on or before the fee payment date shown above, or on or before such dates as shall be notified in writing to the Licensee,

failing which the Secretary of State may revoke this Licence.

Radio Equipment Use

- 7. The Licensee must ensure that the Radio Equipment is constructed and used only in accordance with the provisions specified in the schedulc(s). Any proposal to amend any detail specified in the schedule(s) must be agreed with the Secretary of State in advance and implemented only after this Licence has been varied and/or reissued accordingly.
- 8. The Licensee must ensure that the Radio Equipment is only used by persons who have been authorised by the Licensee to do so and that such persons are made aware of, and of the requirement to comply with, the terms of this Licence.

Access and Inspection


- 9. The Licensee shall permit a person authorised by the Secretary of State:
 - () to have access to the Radio Equipment; and
 - (a) to inspect this Licence and the Radio Equipment,

at any and all reasonable times or, when in the opinion of that person an urgent situation exists, at any time to ensure that the Radio Equipment is being used in accordance with the terms of this Licence.

Modification, Restriction and Closedown

10. A person authorised by the Secretary of State may require the Radio Equipment, or any part thereof, to be modified or restricted in use, or temporarily or permanently

closed down immediately if in the opinion of the person authorised by the Secretary of State:

- () a breach of this Licence has occurred; and/or
- (a) the use of the Radio Equipment is causing or contributing to undue interference to the use of other authorised radio equipment.
- 11. The Secretary of State may require the Radio Equipment to be modified or restricted in use, or temporarily or permanently closed down either immediately or on the expiry of such period as may be specified:
 - () in the interests of long term spectrum planning; or
 - (a) in the event of a national or local state of emergency being declared.

The Secretary of State shall exercise this power by a written notice served on the Licensee and/or by a general notice applicable to holders of this class of Licence published by public broadcast or in the London, Edinburgh and Belfast Gazettes.

Interpretation

- (d) the Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply to the Licence as it applies to an Act of Parliament.

DESCRIPTION OF RADIO EQUIPMENT COVERED BY THIS LICENCE

This schedule forms part of Licence 266109, issued to REVCOM, the Licensec on 25 April 2003, and describes the Radio Equipment covered by the Licence and the purpose for which the Radio Equipment may be used.

0. Description of the Radio Equipment licensed

In this Licence, the Radio Equipment means sending and receiving station(s) ("mobile stations") for wireless telegraphy as defined in paragraph 2 below.

1. Purpose of the Radio Equipment

Subject to the administrative and technical requirements set out in this and the subsequent schedule(s) to this Licence, the Licensee and any person authorised to act on the Licensee's behalf is hereby authorised to send and receive messages concerning the business of the Licensee between the mobile stations.

2. Conformity Assessment Requirements

The Radio Equipment covered by this Licence shall be subject to and comply with the appropriate Interface Requirement (IR) or for equipment first placed on the market before 8 April 2000, is required to be type approved in accordance with the appropriate published technical performance standards authorised at the date of installation of the Radio Equipment, subject to any modifications authorised by the Radiocommunications Agency ("the Agency").

The Licensee shall provide acceptable documentary evidence of conformity on request within 28 days, for all or any part of the systems, to a representative of the Secretary of State for Trade and Industry.

3. Special conditions relating to the activities of the Licensee

- () The Licensee shall ensure that the Radio Equipment is:
 - () used for voice transmission only, unless authorised in paragraph 5 below or in the subsequent schedule(s);
 - (i) not used to transmit music, broadcast programmes or obscene or offensive language;



- (ii) not used as a public address system; and
- (iii) not used to send misleading messages.
- (a) Upon receipt of messages not connected with the business of the Licensee, the Licensee or any person using the Radio Equipment shall not:
 - () make known the contents of any such message, its origin or destination, its existence or the fact of its receipt to any person, except to a duly authorised officer of Her Majesty's Government, a person authorised by the Secretary of State or in the course of legal proceedings or for the purpose of any report thereof; and
 - (i) retain any copy or make any use of any such message, or allow it to be reproduced in writing, copied or made use of.
- (b) The Licensee shall be permitted to use the frequencies set out in the Schedule(s) to this license anywhere in the UK.
- (d) The Licensee shall not install or use a base station unless prior authority has been obtained from the Agency Local Licensing Centre responsible for the location of the intended base station.

4. Facilities

The use of the following facilities is permitted without specific authorisation, provided that no undue interference is caused to other authorised radio users:

- () revertive calling;
- (a) user identification;
- (b) remote receivers;
- (c) selective calling; and
- (d) the following methods of voice privacy:
 - () frequency inversion;
 - (i) band inversion;
 - (ii) band scrambling; and
 - (iii) rolling code inversion.



5. Interpretation

In this and the subsequent schedule(s):

- () a "UK General service" is a radio system which can be used anywhere within the United Kingdom or within a particular area of the United Kingdom;
- (a) "revertive calling" means the automatic acknowledgement of messages received by mobile stations by means of predefined status messages;
- (b) "user identification" identifies the user sending a message;
- (c) "remote receiver" is a mobile station that receives messages on licensed frequencies only;
- (d) "selective calling" is a sequence of in-band audio tones normally transmitted immediately prior to the commencement of a voice transmission or transmitted on their own to convey information;
- (e) "single frequency mode" means the use of a single frequency for both transmitting and receiving messages;
- (f) "ERP" means effective radiated power, which is the power radiated from the antenna in the direction of maximum radiation; and
- "IR" means the United Kingdom Radio Interface Requirement published by the Radiocommunications Agency of the Department of Trade and Industry (RA) in accordance with Article 4.1 of directive 1999/5/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on radio equipment and telecommunications terminal equipment (RTTE) and mutual recognition of their conformity. The Directive (O.J.No.L91) was implemented in the UK by the Radio Equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Regulations (S.I. 2000/730).
