There are now other frequencies available and the NEC have decided to allow teams to select any frequency for hand held radios.

For the benefit of compatibility it would be an advantage if teams used handhelds on frequency 1 and frequency 2, but we recognise that there are high band handhelds on the market that teams could use. Hence you may use any of the frequencies below for handhelds. Remember that you will not have exclusive use!

CTCSS and DCS codes are permitted on all frequencies.

## **PMR Licence - READ THIS!**

## Our new licence number is 266109

There have been major changes to the REVCOM licence.

The NEC have opted to drop the PMR general licence in favour of the new Private Business Radio (PBR) Licence

This brings us two major benefits and one slight drawback, but we feel the benefits outweigh the slight drawback.

The two advantages are:

- 1) We have reduced the licence fee to members to a fraction of the previous cost.
- 2) We have access to 15 frequencies that we may use anywhere in the country without notifying the RA. The drawback? well, we will not have exclusive use of the frequencies!

To avoid an uncontrolled free for all, the NEC have decided that vehicle mounted sets must be fitted with frequency 1 firstly, then frequency 2 if a second frequency is to be fitted.

Frequency 1 86.3750 MHz

Frequency 2 86.3625 MHz

This is to ensure that assisting teams can talk to each other, and any event talk in can be done on frequency 1. Both FM and AM are permitted at 5 watts ERP.

Once a set has both frequency 1 and frequency 2 fitted, then set owners may install one or more of the frequencies below should they wish.

Frequency 3 86.3375 MHz

Frequency 4 86.3500 MHz

Frequency 5 77.6875 MHz

## Cook's Corner



# Quick Braised Lamb Roll

Ingredients 800a (1.75

800g (1.75 lb) breast of lamb, boned

salt and pepper to taste

1 tbsp chopped chives

1 tbsp chopped fresh parsley

rind of 1 lemon

2 slices of bread, crumbed

350g (12oz) sausage meat

sprig of rosemary

2 tbsp lemon juice

250ml (8 fl oz) chicken stock

4 large carrots

2 medium turnips

4 large potatoes

half tbsp beef extract

1 tbsp honey

## Method

Trim excess fat off the lamb, and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Heat oven to 200 °C (400 °F/Gas 6). Mix chives, parsley, lemon rind and breadcrumbs and sausage meat together, and form into a roll.

Roll lamb around the sausage meat roll and tie up.

Place the lamb roll into a large casserole with rosemary, lemon juice and some stock. Cut vegetables and place around the lamb. Cook for 45 mins. While cooking make up a paste using the beef extract and honey. Now remove the lamb and coat with the paste. Return to the oven and continue cooking until the meat and vegetables are done to your liking. This will take 15 - 25 mins according to taste and oven type.

## PC Corner

#### Viruses

The problem of viruses on the net has become so severe that it is unlikely that you can escape the problem. Even worse, there are now supposedly legitimate businesses in China that are targeting P.C.'s in the west to gather useful information. I have seen an enormous rise in the number of such attacks that my firewall is trapping. Tracing the source of the attack is simple, but stopping it is more or less impossible, as the service providers that the attackers use will not respond to requests for action.

Those of you who follow my rantings will know that I use a separate hard drive running Linux for my net sessions so that they will not get anything from me! However, you should get a firewall in now if you have not already. I could suggest Zone Alarm as one option, but there are other free ones around. Paying for a firewall gets added features such as scanning your e-mail both in and out etc. Interested in finding out who those IP addresses belong to? then download a cheapy called "HotWhois" this will trace the owner of the offensive packet for you, it is easy to use. Then start e-mailing the service provider complaining about their user, the more that honest users complain, the more chance we have of forcing the offenders out of service.

Fed up with the holes in Internet Explorer? try Opera. Version 7 is out, and like Netscape it integrates browsing and mail in one package. It is worth a look. Better still get Linux on your box!

They will take almost any type of PMR equipment, working or not.


